Sealed Bids for the above referenced project, located in Lewiston, Idaho, will be received by the Port of Lewiston Administrative Office at 1626 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue N, Lewiston, ID 83501 until **1:00 p.m. local time on April 1, 2024**, at which time they will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The project involves demolition of the existing ore conveyor structure located at the Confluence Riverfront property along the Clearwater River, including implementation of best management practices (BMPs) to prevent debris from entering the river. The project is not funded with Federal Funds and Davis Bacon wages will not apply.

A mandatory pre-bid conference and site walk-through is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. local time on March 25, 2024 at the Port of Lewiston. Parties will meet at the Port Administrative Office for a brief project discussion and then proceed to the nearby conveyor site. **Bids will not be accepted from Bidders that do not attend the mandatory pre-bid conference.**

All Bids must be signed and accompanied by evidence of authority to sign. Bids must be accompanied by Bid Security in the form of a bid bond, certified check, cashier's check or cash in the amount of 5% of the amount of the bid proposal. Said bid security will be forfeited to the Port of Lewiston as liquidated damages should the successful Bidder fail to enter into contract in accordance with their proposal as specified in the Instructions to Bidders.

The Owner will consider all acceptable Bids on a basis consistent with the bid package and also consider whether the Bidder is a responsible Bidder. In accordance with Idaho statute 70-1613, the Owner may award the contract to the best responsible bid, whether or not the same be the lowest bid. Before a contract will be awarded for work contemplated herein, the Owner will conduct such investigation as is necessary to determine the performance record and ability of the Bidder to perform the size and type of work specified under this Contract. Upon request, the Bidder shall submit such information as deemed necessary by the Owner to evaluate the Bidder's qualifications.

The Port of Lewiston reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, waive any nonmaterial irregularities in the Bids received, and to accept the proposal deemed most advantageous to the best interest of the Owner.
